
### SCHOOL PROFILE 2024 - 2025

### ACCREDITATION

Mt. Mercy Academy is accredited by the Mercy Education System of the Americas.

### POPULATION

54% of students live in the city of Buffalo. All other students commute from the surrounding cities and suburbs of Western New York.



### CURRICULUM

All students will take courses in Art or Music, English, Languages other than English (Spanish), Mathematics, Physical Education, Theology, Social Studies, and Science.

Students will graduate with at least 29 credits. (exceptions to this are made on a case-by-case basis)

Mount Mercy Academy Diploma with Advanced Distinction with Honors -contingent upon successful completion of the required Mount Mercy required courses, in addition, successful completion of 3 college-level courses.



### HONORS COURSES

For freshmen who enter Mount Mercy Academy with excellent grades and recommendations, honors courses are eligible in English, Global, and Life Science- Biology to provide a more rigorous and challenging curriculum, as well as preparation for future enrollment in honors, AP, and college-level courses.

### ACADEMIES

Science and Health Care: Mount Mercy Academy and the Catholic Health System offer a unique career internship program for students to experience professions firsthand. Students begin interacting with the professional community as freshmen through the Health Care Career Club and continue through the Academy of Science and Health Care. Each student enrolled in this program has the opportunity to intern in a career of her choice, which is not necessarily Healthcare specific.

Women in the Social Sciences: Mount Mercy Academy offers a different route for students to take who are interested in the Social Sciences. Students can apply to start in 10th grade. Requirements include taking social studies electives, attending field trips, and completing shadowing and internship opportunities.

**Visual Arts Academy:** Mount Mercy Academy has added this new academy that is designed for students with a strong interest in the visual arts. While many of these students will someday work in an art-related career, others are simply passionate about the arts and plan to pursue a career in another field. Students will participate in a variety of classes, field trips, workshops, lectures, art shows, and other activities.

The Business and Finance Academy: The Mount Mercy Business and Finance Academy gives students the tools to make smart financial decisions and learn how to navigate the business world. In the 2021-2022 academic year, the students in the Business Academy showed their dedication and creativity with the official opening of a women-owned and student-run cafe called the Magic Market. Students in the Academy work at the on-campus market every morning during homeroom and during select sporting events. The goal is to empower students to pursue entrepreneurship.

The Communications Academy: The Mount Mercy Communications Academy is dedicated to creating high quality media that will showcase events at Mount Mercy and in our community. Members of this academy will have an opportunity to report on school and community events, create short videos for TikTok, Instagram, and Facebook, and to attend field trips and workshops. The Academy will explore many aspects of communication from podcasts to poster art, and marketing to memes.

The Leadership Academy: The Mount Mercy Leadership Academy has achieved an impressive level of prestige based on the rigorous curriculum. Students from local 8th-grade middle schools compete for acceptance into the academy based on the recommendation of their middle school principal. Once accepted, students participate in experiential learning and service opportunities that will enable them to realize the many gifts that they have been given and understand their role in using these gifts in order to make the world a better place. Students who participate in the Leadership Academy complete service work, both in and out of school, that incorporates the Critical Concerns of the Sisters of Mercy.

### FAST FACTS

- Mount Mercy Academy offers over 40 electives in Art, Music, Social Studies, English, Languages other than English, Math, and Science
- All students will complete at least 100 hours of community service throughout their four years at Mount Mercy.
- Mount Mercy Academy offers fifth-year courses in Art, Spanish, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies
- Mount Mercy offers 17 interscholastic sports teams. Over 45% of students participate in athletics and about 45% of those students participate on two or more sports teams. Mount Mercy offers over 20 different clubs and organizations.

### MCAULEY SCHOLARS

Students nominated as candidates must have an overall GPA of 95% and take at least two AP or college/honors courses. Students in grades 10, 11, and 12 are eligible.


